What To Bring To The Festival of Strength & Courage

Parents and Families, Please bring the following foods & costumes:

FOOD FOR FEAST: Please bring the food listed for your grade(s). When in doubt bring more rather than less- it's better to take some home than not have enough for everyone! Please bring food to the designated area in front of the office between 8am and 9am.

COSTUMES: For the play of 'Knight Michael and the Taming of the Dragon' presented by Mountain Oak School students at the Festival or Courage and Strength on October 1, all students should wear or bring to school the following items that will be part of their costume. The below items must be at the school by 9am or worn to school October 1.

IMPORTANT:

There is very little shade.

If you have a shade canopy,
please bring it to the school Friday,
at 8am or the site at 10am.

Grade	Food To Bring	Costume To Bring
1st	Paper plates, napkins, bowls, forks, spoons, cups (hot & cold), for 200+ people.	Gnomes Girls and Boys: Blue shirts, short or long sleeves; dark brown or dark blue pant or floor length skirt
2nd	Beverages: a gallon of drinking water or apple juice (no sugar added)	Knights George and Georgette Boys and Girls: Red shirts, preferably long sleeved; and dark pant or dark skirt (not black)
3rd	Apple Foods: Apple slices, applesauce, apple bars, apple pie, driedapples, other fruit, etc.	Farmers and Harvesters: Boys and Girls: Brown, tan, beige pants/overalls or floor length skirt and brown, beige or tan shirt, short or long sleeved
4th	Pumpkin foods: Pumpkin bread, bars, turnovers, squash or pumpkin soup, roasted seeds.	Trades People Girls and Boys: Solid color pants, floor length skirts, and shirts. These can be any color. Fourth grade students also need costume props: baskets with flowers, fake breads, fake vegetables, chimney sweep tools, cobbler tools: hammers/tools old style leather shoes, tinker tools; old style pots, tiny hammer. Please label these items with your name and send them to school as soon as possible, so we know what we have available.
5th	Corn Foods: corn bread or chips & popcorn.	Wealthier Village Citizens Boys: Dark dress pants, solid long sleeved shirt Girls: long sleeved colorful shirt preferably no prints
6th	Beans & salsa, bean dip.	Dragon; Boys and Girls: Dark pants, dark shoes
7th	Spanish rice & nuts	Knights and Ladies, Ladies: dress shoes with no heels, to go with the purple costumes Knights: black shoes
8th	Veggie Trays	Light Beings and Knights Michael Girls and Boys: white or very light colored clothing to be worn underneath costume. White socks or shoes.
