New 3 <sup>rd</sup> grade teacher is 1 <sup>st</sup> -8 <sup>th</sup> certified Both are new transplants to Prescott, and thus are available to accept these positions mid- year. We are very fortunate for this circumstance.  Edie asked about 6 <sup>th</sup> grade assistant: Vonda clarified that assistant in 6 <sup>th</sup> grade was contingent on having an over cap number of students, we are not over cap so there will not be an assistant.

We do not have a full enrollment report at this time, but numbers appear to be stable with several new enrollments and enrollment interviews. In 6th grade, we have lost two students and gained one student. Today we have 1 new student in 7<sup>th</sup>, 1 new student in 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 1 new student in 4<sup>th</sup>, as well as preK and K enrollments.

Lots of warmth toward the new teachers, they can come to anyone for support if they have any needs. Winter Spiral was lovely.
