1.	Discuss new board member interview questions Instead of letter of interest, give questions for candidate to answer and then discuss the similar questions at the interview. After the interview they will apply for IVP card and be presented to board as a candidate with a spokesperson from the interview give a reason/summary of why they are recommending them. Four people (faculty, community, administration, and board member) on the committee.	
2.	Discuss new school name ideas -community effort and upper grades and community can suggest with names and faculty and board come up with 2-3 and the community would vote on final name. Faculty connection to graphic designer in the community who can help.	
3.	Discuss New Charter Vision and Mission Statement - still plan to utilize some tools of Waldorf-inspired schools Admin and some faculty met with superintendent and he supports us and would like us to adopt a guided reading model. Need funds and a curriculum team. Community likes science and nature study. Whole child centered, restorative, nature, we need to strengthen academics, project based, publicly funded alternative learning, change the world one child at a time (mission). Combination of teaching philosophies - take best from different philosophies and integrate into who we are to serve each child uniquely (vision). Faculty and admin will work on mission and vision and bring it back to board. Discuss being private school with ESA voucher. Would increase our funding, but more work for the parents. Staff member hired to support the parents in getting ESA voucher (community liaison). Could engage homeschool community. Why are people leaving to be homeschooled? Coach Mike will look into what it takes to become a private school or hybrid private/public.
